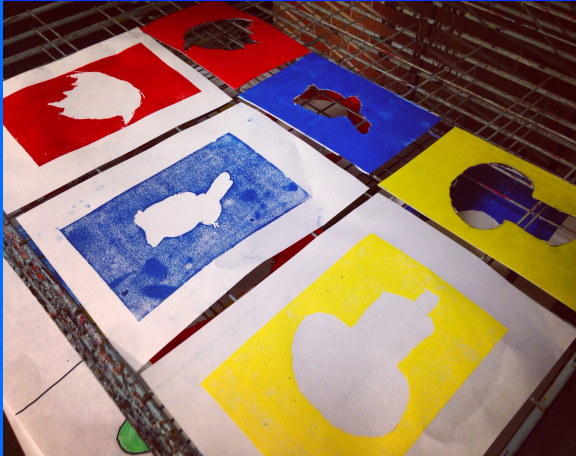

Third graders at Lincoln Elementary School have finished designing their own Pop Art inspired prints. We are using ink, foam plates, and brayers to run our first prints. Students will experiment with layering two primary colors, which in printmaking is referred to as “multiscreen” printing. At the left, you can see examples of the first layer.

#### **Kindergarten**
